They have been working on their first feature length documentary, *The Bridge Master's Daughter* for five years. Their other documentaries *Montaña de Luz* and *Old Radicals* won the Crystal Heart Award at the Heartland Film Festival and the DER Award in the International Documentary Challenge, respectively. *The Bridge Master's Daughter* was born out of Elisa's deep love of Peru and her passion for the stories of her people which has been reflected in the intimacy of the shooting for this film.
