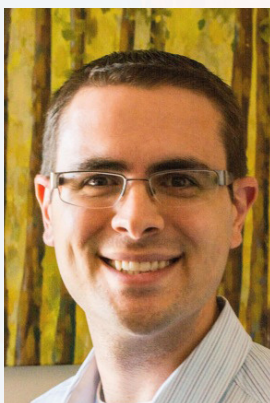

Led by André Zampaulo (California State University), this 2-hour workshop will provide an overview of the sound patterns of Portuguese, including its most salient dialectal manifestations in Brazil, Portugal, and Portuguese-speaking Africa, as well as contrastive examples with the sounds of Spanish. The workshop will deepen participants' understanding of Portuguese content to use in the K-12 classroom. There will also be time for Q&A.
